Our work areas

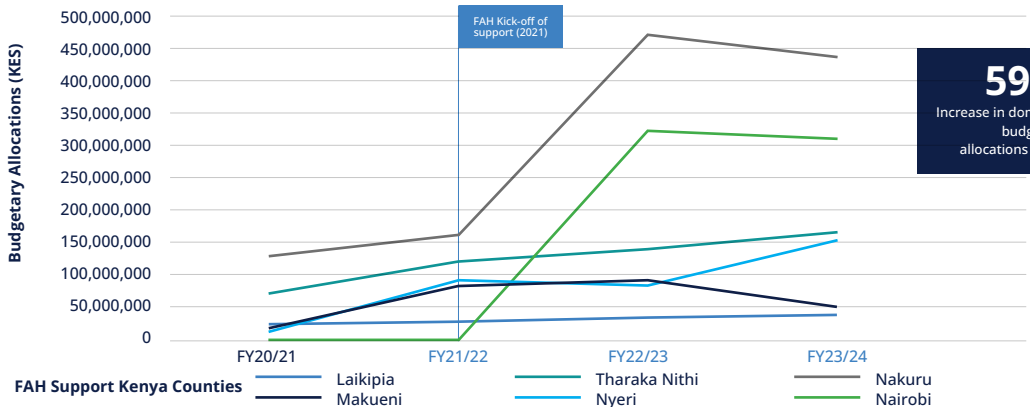
- **Country government support:** Long-term on-site technical & financing support on primary and community health.
- **Analytical toolkit:** Develop and offer toolkits to support country costings, investment cases, and financing pathways.
- **Financing products/ modalities:** Working with donors & financing industry to design, develop and deploy new/modified financial products.
- **Awareness and education:** Communicate case for investment, build thought leadership and share capacity-building material.

Country Example: Our Strides in Kenya



FAH has worked in 6 counties: **Nairobi, Nyeri, Nakuru, Tharaka Nithi, Makeni and Laikipia from 2021 – 2024** to support their community health financing needs, through engagement of both Department of Health, Department of Finance and other key stakeholders.

Community Health Advocacy efforts

- Executive and Legislatives arms of government engagement for increased domestic investments for Community Health.
- Amplification of CHWs voices through 6 docuseries and 12 articles to Regional and Global platforms.
- Stakeholder alignment through establishment of Community Health Partnership Coordination Committees across the 6 counties.

Initiatives to close the Community Health Financing Gap:

- **Launch of African Front Line First - Catalytic Fund:** USD 100M raised to accelerate the scale up of community health services in up to 10 African countries by 2030.
- **Strategic Initiative:** The Strategic Initiatives aims to address critical community health systems gaps and ensure high-quality implementation and utilization of GC7 and C19RM resource. Kenya is a beneficiary receiving USD 750,000.
